Regional Workshop on Enhancing Tribal Identity




The New Delhi YMCA (NDY) - Program, Cultural & Tribal Committee (PCTC) organized the Regional Workshop on Enhancing Tribal Identity, on Saturday, 19th March 2022 at the NDY Heinz Auditorium. After a long gap of more than 2 years, the Tribal Community Leadership got the opportunity to assemble and express their views, share their experiences, and analyze the current status & situation of the Regional & National Tribal Scenario. The Hybrid Program (Online + Offline) was attended by Key Dignitaries from the Tribal Welfare Community along with Elite Leaders and Influencers from the Corporate World who came together to share their knowledge & experience to strategize & explore the various facets of the Tribal Communities and their current and future identity within the Society at large.

The Program began with an Opening Prayer by Rev. Joel Prem, Chairman, PCTC followed by Welcome Greetings shared by NDY President Mr. Jovial Vaghela and NDY GS & CEO Mr. Mark Clive. This was proceeded by a Special Welcome Performance by the Tribal Community who sang and danced in folk tradition and welcomed the gathering. NDY SHD Activity Report



The Department of Social and Human Development continues its efforts to create awareness in the society with the Children, Youth, and Women on various issues which affect the normal life of the community people. The Community Development Centre Daya Basti, Sunlight Colony, and CDC Kalyanpuri organized Awareness Generation Sessions on 'Personal Hygiene and Sanitation on 15th, 19th, 21st, 22nd, and 23rd March 2022 respectively. The objective of the program was to create awareness among Adolescent Girls on the importance of personal hygiene. The sessions were taken by Visiting Faculties of the respective CDCs. 15 women participated at CDC Daya Basti, 48 Students at CDC Sunlight Colony, and 12 Students in CDC Kalyanpuri participated in the programs. The Community Development Centre Sunlight Colony organized AGP on 'Nutrition & Healthy Diet' on 15th March 2022. The main purpose of organizing such a program was to provide knowledge about low-cost Nutritious Diet / Food for Good Health. The session was conducted by Ms. Sushma, Field Administrative Worker, CDC Sunlight Colony, and 15 women participated in the program. The Community Development Centre Karpoori Thakur organized an AGP on 'Right to Education' with Community Women on 15th March 2022. The program was to aware parents of the Right of their children to free and compulsory education.

Also discussed with them about the process of school admission through EWS. 15 students attended this program. An AGP was organized on "Career Guidance" with the youth of CDC Kalyanpuri on 19th March 2022. It was an effort to educate and aware the youth on Career Guidance and various Professional Courses after passing out Class XII. The session was taken by the Field Supervisor of the Community Development Center (CDC). 10 Students were present during the session. CDC Kalyanpuri organized Awareness Generation Session on 'Gender Discrimination and Personal Safety' with children on 12th, 21st & 22nd March 2022. They were told about the Good Touch and Bad Touch. Also about the role of Male & Females in the family and society at large. The sessions were taken by the Field Administrative Worker and Visiting Faculty of CDC Kalyanpuri. 16 youth on 12th and 25 each on 21st & 22nd March 2022 participated in the program. In view of the health of the women in the society, CDC Daya Basti organized an AGP on 'Anti Natal (Prenatal) and Post Natal Care' with SHG women on 14th March'22. The purpose was to encourage women to care for and maintain the physical, mental, and social health of mother and baby. It was an effort to educate women on nutrition, personal hygiene, and the process of delivery of the child. The session was conducted by the Visiting Faculties of the Community Development Centers (CDCs) in which 14 participants were present. CDC Karpoori Thakur conducted a workshop on 'Save Water' with community women on 22nd March 2022. It was to motivate women about their welfare and awareness about the scarcity of clean water and sensitize them about the conservation of water, a precious resource. The session was conducted by the Field Supervisor. 13 participants from the CDC Karpoori Thakur participated in the program.

An AGP session was conducted at Savda Ghevra CDC on 19th March'22 on the theme, 'Say No to Plastic'. The objective of the program was to create awareness about the importance of the environment in human life and to discuss and motivate people to save the environment from plastic bags as these are non – biodegradable and are harmful to our environment. Another session of AGP was organized at CDC Savda-Ghevra on 'Save Tree & Save Earth' on 22nd March 2022 in which 26 Students joined. Both the sessions were conducted by the Visiting Faculties of the Community Development Centers. One more AGP was organized at the same Center on the theme 'Consumer Right' on the occasion of World Consumer Day on 15th March'22. The program was organized to provide information on the marketing of goods and services and to create awareness about the rights of customers. 09 student participated in the Programme, in which Visiting Faculty of the Community Development Center was the Resource Person.




Noteworthy Newsbytes
