To, The Members New Delhi YMCA

Dear Members, Warm Greetings to all of you!

As I come to the end of a very fruitful tenure, I thank God for all the blessings and graces in guiding me at every step during the year. The road was not smooth, there were challenges but with the hard work of the Office Bearers and with support from most Board Members a considerable number of changes were brought about. Many new policies have been introduced to bring transparency and accountability to the working of the New Delhi YMCA. Significant recommendations were made to reduce cost in the form of:

- The Outsourcing Manpower Agency (Security) which for the last 20 years was charging 5% to 7% service charges. The service charges of the new agency taken from 1st April 2023 is at 0%, leading to huge savings to the New Delhi YMCA of over 20 lakhs per year.
- A substantial amount has been saved in the IT and Marketing Department which had inflated costs earlier (approximately saving 30 lakhs per year). New ideas to monitor this have also been recommended.
- Better vendor management was recommended at the Tourist Hostel, bringing down expenditure and the use of corporate cards to purchase items online. For our Members and their families reduced rates on tea/coffee, sandwiches, etc and special discounts of 30% are given at the Dining hall.
- YMCA Public School at Nizamuddin East has transformed into a strong pillar reaching Class 11 and shortly Science stream will be added to its academics.
- A Carnival was held in December 2022 which was a grand success to generate funds for a School project in Hodal, Haryana to create a hub of Skill development unit including Sports Coaching for the rural poor at their doorstep. In addition, it will also help the existing Class VII level school there.
- Social Development Programme, the face and mission of New Delhi YMCA continued with dedication to its development initiatives to help the slum and resettlement colonies. Many new 'Singer' sewing machines 19 in total which were lying unused at Hodal were relocated to CDCs to help out more women in tailoring and cutting.
- Remedial classes for 9th to 12th students at community development centres and financial assistance to a number of young students enable them to score more than 70% in their examinations.
- The Tourism and Hospitality sector saw a big upward jump enhancing the Tourist Hostel cum Programme Centre with best ever results. The average occupancy was as high as 67% bringing in good revenue with a surplus. Greater Noida Programme Centre also made a substantial contribution.
- Staff are being refunded all salaries deducted during the pandemic (2020-2022)
- Annual Increments to Executives pending since 2018-2019 have been released and are being distributed on a monthly basis.
- The Secretary Cadre has been strengthened to ensure smooth and consistent development. Three new trainee secretaries have been appointed from May this year. A number of Secretaries and Executives were promoted in 2022-2023 to motivate and recognize their good work.
- The Code of Conduct for Election was modified in the interest of all those taking part in the election process.
- The Basketball and Tennis courts at Greater Noida Programme Centre have been refurbished and increased in size to the International level to further help our young budding players.
- Lastly, it is a matter of great pride that NDY has for the first time achieved an income of Rs. 40 Crores plus in a financial year (2022 – 2023). The actuals are Rs.42.30 Crores and we are in surplus post-Covid, an amount of Rs. 4 Crores has been added to the Fixed Deposits.

My Sincere thanks and much appreciation to the Board of Directors, Office Bearers, Chairmen and Members of various Committees each and every Member of NDY, the GS & CEO and his team of Secretaries, Executives and the entire team of Staff for all your support, co-operation, sincere efforts and valuable contributions.

I wish the new President, his team and the new General Secretary & CEO all God's blessings and success.

The Community Development Department of YMCA Sattal works in five villages in and around Sattal, Nainital through 18 self-help groups, 16 of which are for the benefit of women and 2 for men. The YMCA Sattal, since its humble beginning, in 2009 has sought to serve the local community through its development programs. The development program focuses on providing the women with much-required information and guidance on the following:

- i) Government programs/schemes that benefit the rural community
- ii) Health and hygiene
- iii) Mother and Child Health
- iv) Vocational training

v) Financial stability through cooperative savings

Through the above-mentioned activities, we endeavour to assist the rural womenfolk of this region in improving their lives. Mrs Shashi Singh, our Field Supervisor through her regular visits and meetings guides and provides much-needed information to the ladies. They are taught to maintain hygiene in and around their homes which ultimately help improve a family's health. A lot depends on the women who work hard the whole day to look after their families and their cattle. Therefore it is important to equip them with life skills that benefit them and their families in the long run which is the focus of the community development initiatives of YMCA Sattal. One of the important focus areas is vocational training. The YMCA has trained hundreds of women through its vocational training courses in cutting & tailoring, knitting, beautician, Makram, cushion & soft toy making, etc.

The above courses have given them skills to add to the family income and most of them have started their own small income-generating businesses from their own homes. Thereby, serving their communities and also earning for their families. During the past year, the YMCA Program Centre at Dorothy Villa also conducted short-term courses in basic computing and English speaking. Seven young students benefited from these courses.

On Saturday, 25 March 2023, YMCA Sattal organized a valedictory ceremony to present the certificates and awards to the ladies and students who successfully completed their courses. Honorable Mrs Sarita Arya, Member of the Legislative Assembly, Nainital was the Chief Guest of the ceremony. The ceremony started with an invocation song and prayer led by Mrs Meena Pradeep. Mr Mark Clive, GS & CEO, welcomed the gathering. Mr Felix Fernandes, President, New Delhi YMCA and Mr Peter Prem, Chairman, YMCA Sattal shared greetings on behalf of the New Delhi YMCA.
