# DEPARTMENT OF SPORTS

The New Delhi YMCA Department of Sports has recently revamped its activities and programs with the inclusion of Process refinement, Preventive Maintenance Scheduling, Infrastructural Upgrades, Program Enhancement, Lesson Plans, Fitness Programs, etc. leading to an increase in overall efficiency, proliferation of membership across activities, and competence in the allocation of resources.

**Swimming Pool:** The Swimming Pool has been revived and quality standards are being monitored and maintained on a daily basis. A detailed Maintenance Schedule has been devised and implemented to ensure efficient and effective cleaning and maintenance of safety and hygiene standards. The Membership for Swimming Coaching and Practice Sessions is currently at 489+ Members, which include new registrations and renewals.

**Fitness Centre:** The Fitness Centre has undergone major upgrades and new equipment has been added to the existing machines, based on the requisitions of the Membership and to expand the scope of operations. Another new inclusion at the Fitness Centre is the implementation of Exercise and Nutrition Cards which track the development of each member and provide them with a clear perspective regarding their efforts v/s transitions over time. The current membership is 136+ and new registrations are increasing gradually.

**Lawn Tennis:** One of the most successful ventures of the Department of Sports has been Lawn Tennis (Coaching and Practice) whereby regular increase in membership is witnessed. The Coaching schedule has been revised and Group and Individual Coaching have become even more productive & effective. The current membership for July – August 2024, is 70+ members.

Karate: The kids and children attending Karate Coaching have been allocated a dedicated space in the Y School of Music Recreation Hall, for Indoor classes during adverse weather conditions, so that classes are not postponed or cancelled. The classes schedules have been renewed and increased batches have been introduced as a result of the Dedicated Space Allocations. This has led to a surge in the membership registrations which is currently at 22+ and is increasing stably. Basketball: The Basketball Court underwent some repair and maintenance in order to create a better playing surface and provide a better facility for Basketball Coaching. The Membership statistics for July – August 2024 is 25+ members and new registrations are being received periodically.

**Volleyball:** The sport of Volleyball has always been a trademark of YMCAs across the Globe. The Volleyball Coaching at New Delhi YMCA has been overhauled and the Members for July – August are 30+ students. Special attention is being paid to ensure that this number increases over time.



# DEPARTMENT OF SPORTS

### The New Delhi YMCA Invitational Aquatic Championship 2024

The New Delhi YMCA, Department of Sports organized the New Delhi YMCA Invitational Aquatic Championship 2024 from 22nd August to 24th August 2024 at the New Delhi YMCA Swimming Pool (Affiliated with the Delhi Swimming Association). The Programme was a Grand Success with 861 participants (Boys & Girls) from 75 schools in and around Delhi NCR competed in 125 activities, over a 3-Day event. The activities included 50 M Freestyle; 50 M Butterfly; 50 M Backstroke; 100 M Freestyle; 100 M Butterfly; 100 M Backstroke; 50 M Breast stroke; 4x50 Medley Relay; 200 M Individual Medley; 100 M Breast stroke; 4x50 Freestyle Relay.

The Best Swimmer Trophy in Boys category was won by Aarav Tyagi of Modern School, Barakhamba Road, Delhi and in Girls category was won by Harshit Lakhina of Bal Bharti Public School, G.R.

The Group Championship Trophy in the Boys category was won by Modern School, Barakhamba Road, Delhi, and in the Girls category, it was won by Birla Vidya Niketan School, Delhi.

The Overall Team Championship Trophy was won by Birla Vidya Niketan School, Delhi and the Runner's up Trophy was won by the Modern School, Barakhamba Road, Delhi for both Boys and Girls categories in the New Delhi YMCA Aquatic Champion.

The Program was well attended & appreciated by the Participants & Parents resulting in a positive impact and holistic development through this undertaking.

### Cancer Screening Camp at CDC Savda Ghevra

Community Development Centre Savda Ghevra organized a Free Cancer Screening Camp & Health Checkup Camp on 19th July 2024 at BVK 'G' Block in collaboration with the Can Support Organization and Rajiv Gandhi Cancer Institute & Research Centre (RGCIRC). The facilities during the camp included PAP Smear Test, Clinical Oral Examination, Clinical Breast Examination, Blood Pressure Monitor, and Random Blood Sugar test. A team of Doctors and Nurses from Rajeev Gandhi Hospital was there in the Cancer Screening Camp. The focus was to create awareness about the cancer disease and also the information was given if diagnosed with any kind of malignancy, what should be done and where to approach. There were 100 registrations in the Cancer Screening Camp at BVK 'G' Block, CDC Savda Ghevra.

The Free Cancer Screening Camp was very successful and was highly valued and appreciated by the Community people.

#### **Awareness Generation Programme**

Awareness Session on Menstrual Health & Hygiene was organized on 8th July 2024 at Sunlight Colony and again on & 26th July 2024 at Karpoori Thakur with Adolescent Girls and Women The objective of the programme was to increase awareness among Adolescent Girls on Menstruation Health & Hygiene. Also to create Awareness about the myths and misconception associated with the Menstruation Cycle and importance of use of Sanitary Napkins. The resource person was Ms. Paramjeet, Educationist & Ms. Seema Malhotra, Educationist from Parivar Sewa Sansthan. 63 students participated in the programme.

Awareness Generation Programme on "Non Traditional Livelihood Programme" was organized on 8th July 2024 at Community Development Centre Kalyanpuri with women and girls. The objective of the Programme was to empower women to become professional drivers, also to enable them to gain remunerative 'livelihoods with dignity'. The Resource person was Ms. Sweety and Ms. Asha from Azad Foundation.19 Participants participated in the programme.

Awareness Generation Programme on "Mensuration Health & Hygiene" was organized on 26th July 2024 with Adolescent Girls at Community Development Centre Karpoori Thakur. The objective of the Programme was to increase awareness among Adolescent Girls on Menstruation Cleanliness during period. Also create Awareness about the myths and misconception associated with the Menstruation Cycle and importance of use of Sanitary Napkins. The Resource Person was Ms. Seema Malhotra, Educationist from Parivar Sewa Sansthan and 36 participants participated in the Programme.

Awareness Generation Program on "Waste Management" was organized on 30th July 2024 with the Students of Remedial & Coaching classes at Community Development Centre Daya Basti. The objective of the programme was to provide information about the system for proper waste segregation. Information was also given that separation of hazardous and non-hazardous waste could be done by installing dustbins or monitoring garbage disposal sites. This could improve recycling rates. Resource person was Ms. Priyanka Sr. Programme Coordinator from "HMD Foundation. 43 Students participated in this programme.

Awareness Generation Programme on "Financial Literacy" was organized on 8th August 2024 at Community Development Centre Kalyanpuri with the Women. The objective of the Programme was to inculcate the habit of saving among women and how to avoid getting into scam by Online /Offline Fraud. The Resource Persons was Mr. Vinit, Financial Literacy Counsellor from ICICI Foundation. 25 Women participated in the programme.

Awareness Session on "Liver Care" with Youth & Women was organized on 17th August 2024 at ALC Mangal Bazar, CDC Sunlight Colony with the help of Liver Care Foundation. The objective of the programme was to raise awareness about the importance of maintaining a healthy Liver, and preventing Liver Diseases. 41 Youth & Women participated in the programme.

#### Donation of Cloth material by Rotary Club of Delhi South Extension

#### Outreach program to Saraswati Publishing House

A group of forty students from classes 7 and 8, YMCA Public School visited Saraswati Publishing House on 2nd August'24 to explore the various stages of book publishing. The visit aimed to enhance students' understanding of how books are created and distributed, from initial conception to final production. This report outlines the key observations and insights from the visit, including interactions with the staff, an overview of the machinery and procedures used in book production. The visit began with an overview of Saraswati Publishing House, including its history, mission, and the range of books it publishes. The students were introduced to key personnel and their roles within the organization.

The process of writing and submitting a manuscript by the author was discussed. The discussion covered the inspiration behind the book, the drafting and revision process including the collaboration with editors and publishers. A publisher's role was explained including the Key points like manuscript evaluation and selection, contract negotiation, editorial guidance and book development, marketing and distribution strategies.

The publishing house explained the importance of copyright registration for protecting the author's intellectual property. This involves registering the manuscript with relevant copyright offices. Authors sign contracts outlining the terms of publication, including royalties, rights, and responsibilities. Designers create cover art and interior layouts. The book's design is reviewed and approved before final production.

Students were given a tour of the printing facilities which included-

Pre-press: Preparing digital files and proofs.

**Printing:** How books are printed using offset or digital printing techniques. Students saw various types of printing presses and learned how they operate.

Binding: The methods used to bind books, including hardcover and paperback options.

**Finishing Equipment:** The process of adding final touches to the book, such as trimming and covering.

The visit concluded with a Q&A session were students were asked questions about the publishing industry, career opportunities, and the future of book publishing. The students were awarded with prizes on every correct answer. Each student was given a certificate of participation and refreshment also. The visit to Saraswati Publishing House provided students with a comprehensive understanding of the book publishing process. They gained valuable insights into the roles of authors, publishers, and the technical aspects of printing and binding.
