## INDUSTRIAL VISIT TO STONEX



On 16th April 2025, an industrial visit was organized for Interior Design students of IFTD (August A & B batches) to STONEX, located at WZ-29, Mansarovar Garden, Opp. Rajouri Garden, Ring Road. The visit aimed to provide practical exposure to flooring and wall cladding materials, focusing on production processes and installation techniques.

Accompanied by faculty members and Ms. Aditi, 40 students participated in the visit. The STONEX sales team facilitated the tour, dividing students into two groups for a structured walkthrough of the Stonex and Stonelam galleries.

Group 1 began with the Stonex gallery, exploring various imported natural stones like onyx, granite, quartzite, and marble, followed by a visit to Stonelam. Group 2 followed the reverse sequence, starting with Stonelam—a premium natural facade material made from 100% natural pigments and manufactured in Italy.

The two-hour visit concluded with an interactive Q&A session, allowing students to clarify their doubts and deepen their understanding.

This visit effectively bridged the gap between theory and practice, enriching the students' academic learning with real-world industry insights.




## **NEW DELHI YMCA** INSTITUTE FOR FASHION TECHNOLOGY AND DESIGN

#### INDUSTRIAL VISIT TO ALOK FASHION PVT. LTD

The Department of Fashion Designing, YMCA, organised an industrial visit to Alok Fashion Pvt. Ltd., a partnership firm specializing in manufacturing and business support services. Established on 17th December 2018, this 7-year-old enterprise operates from its registered office at B-29, Infocity, Sector-34, Gurugram, Haryana. Classified as a micro-enterprise for the financial year 2023-24, the firm plays a significant role as an exporter and manufacturer, supplying to several well-known garment brands across the globe.

This visit provided an excellent opportunity for students to gain first-hand exposure to the operations of a real-world export house. It allowed them to explore and understand various functional departments involved in garment manufacturing and export processes. Ms. Areeza, Merchant Manager at Alok Fashion, warmly welcomed the students and delivered an insightful briefing on the export industry. She led a detailed tour of the facility, explaining the roles and functions of each department. Throughout the visit, supervisors actively engaged with students, addressing their questions and sharing practical insights about industry workflows. The two-hour session covered an in-depth walkthrough of the following departments and areas:

- Showroom
- Design department
- Sampling department
- Documentation
- Fabric and Accessories store
- Different types of Sewing machines and techniques
- Pattern+ Khakha and cost sheets of the orders / Tech Packs
- CAD department
- Stitching and finishing department
- Quality control /Checking





The visit to Alok Fashion N Pvt. Ltd. was highly insightful, offering a real-world perspective on the operations of an export house. The department of Fashion Designing, YMCA organized an Industrial visit to the SAVI FASHION PVT. LTD. It is a Private company incorporated on 02 Dec 1994. The firm has a significant role as an exporter, manufacturer of leather products. It was a great opportunity for students to learn and explore different departments of an export house which supplies to many recognizable garment brands across the globe.

It was a learning journey for students as they practically witnessed different departments of an export house and their functioning. Mr. Nikhil (Merchant Manager) briefed the students about the leather export industry and then handed over to his assistant Mr. Yogesh, gave us a complete tour of the leather export house explaining functions of each department. Supervisors helped students solve their queries and provided them with useful knowledge about the functioning. The session was for around 2 hours and 30 mins, which covered the following details: -

- Showroom
- Documentation
- Leather and Accessories store
- Different types of leather
- Stitching and finishing department
- Quality control /Checking
- Packing and packaging

#### SHOW WINDOW DESIGN STRATEGIES WITH TRANSLITE

An insightful industrial visit was organized for the students of 3rd AID January and AID August batches to Pacific Mall, Netaji Subhash Place, Delhi. Accompanied by faculty members Ms. Aditi Singh and Ms. Palak Kukreja, a total of 34 students participated in the visit, which commenced at 11:00 AM as per the planned schedule.

The main objective of the visit was to have students an overview of "THE PACIFIC MALL". All the students were headed by the faculty and some sign printout sheets and architectural plan of mall which helped them to understand about the different elements of the mall.

At industrial visit students studied about various finishes like: -

- Elements of design
- Overall merchandising techniques
- Basic design style
- Modern day techniques
- Types of services
- Parking design standards
- Retail showroom types, etc.

The visit lasted around 2.5 hours, allowing students to thoroughly observe and analyse the layout and interiors of the mall. It concluded with a Q&A session to clarify concepts and encourage discussion. Students were later assigned reports to reflect their observations and measurements.

This industrial exposure enabled students to connect classroom knowledge with on-ground practices. The experience was both informative and interactive, helping students gain a clearer understanding of translating design theory into real-world applications.

## INDUSTRIAL VISIT SS PRINTS, D-226, SECTOR 63, NOIDA



On April 24, 2025, students from the New Delhi YMCA's (IFTD) Fashion Design & apparel and retail merchandising programs visited SS Prints in Noida, a company specializing in digital screen printing, manual screen printing, digital fabric printing, and computer embroidery.

The visit was guided by Mr. Man Singh, Mr. Sispal, and Mr. Rajan, who provided comprehensive insights into the company's operations. They explained the differences between manual and digital screen printing, highlighting how manual printing allows for artisanal detailing, while digital methods offer precision and efficiency for large-scale production.

The team also demonstrated computer embroidery machines, showcasing how digital patterns are translated into intricate stitched designs, enhancing the aesthetic appeal of garments.

This hands-on experience provided students with a deeper understanding of contemporary textile printing and embroidery techniques, bridging the gap between academic learning and industry practices. The visit emphasized the importance of integrating traditional craftsmanship with modern technology in the evolving fashion industry.

Overall, the industrial visit to SS Prints was an enlightening experience, offering valuable practical knowledge that complements the students' academic curriculum and prepares them for future careers in fashion and textile design.

#### Free Medical Check-Up Camp

The Community Development Centre Savda Ghevra organised a Medical Check - up Camp for General Diagnosis, Skin Care and Eye check-up on 26<sup>th</sup> March 2025 in collaboration with The Leprosy Mission Hospital (TLM) Shahdara. During the camp, screening and diagnosis of health issues were done for the community members, ensuring they receive essential medical attention and guidance.
