

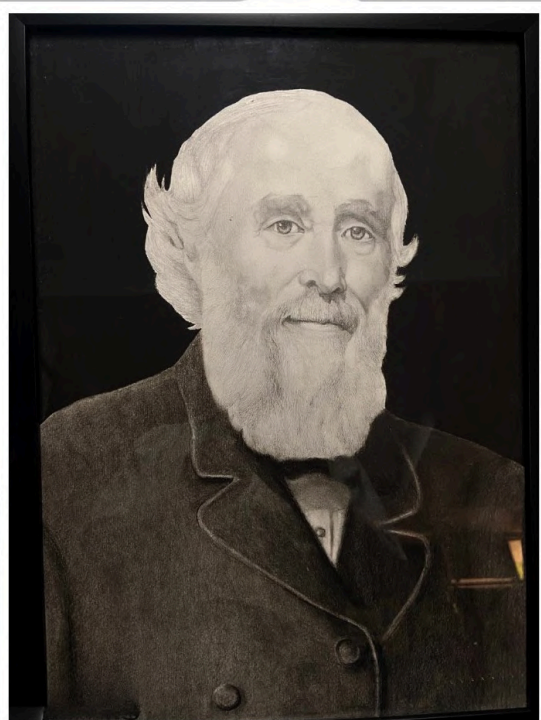

Sir George Williams was a visionary English philanthropist who founded the Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA) in 1844. Deeply moved by the social and spiritual challenges faced by young men during the Industrial Revolution, he sought to create a safe and supportive environment promoting Christian values, personal growth, and community service. What began as a small prayer group in London soon became a global movement, with his legacy continuing to impact lives across the world. In recognition of his lifelong service to humanity, he was knighted by Queen Victoria in 1894. His dedication to youth empowerment laid the foundation for one of the world's oldest and most respected volunteer organizations.

The cover page of this edition features a pencil sketch of YMCA Founder **Sir George Williams**, created by *Mohammed Ubaid*, a talented youth from the SHD Community Development Centre, Savda Ghevra. The sketch, unveiled during the Summer Camp 2025 closing ceremony on 21st June, beautifully reflects YMCA's legacy and the creativity nurtured among young people in our community programs.



The YMCA VISION

The YMCA was officially founded on 6th June 1844. Industrialized London was a place of great turmoil and despair in 1844. For the young men who migrated to the city from rural areas to find jobs, London offered a bleak landscape of tenement housing and dangerous influences.

Twenty two years old Sir George Williams, a farmer-turned-department store worker, was troubled by what he saw. He joined 11 friends to establish the first Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA) to provide a safe and supportive environment for young men, aimed to be a place where young men could find refuge from the hazards of street life, offering Bible study, prayer, and a sense of community. The organization initially focused on religious practices, but later YMCA's drive to address social needs and its inclusive nature for all Classes and Races, distinguished it from other associations. Today YMCA is the oldest and largest youth charity organization in the world, with the aim to support young people to belong, contribute and thrive in their communities.

Founded on Christian values, it seeks to embody Matthew 25:40—"whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me"—by uplifting marginalized communities through holistic development.

The New Delhi YMCA plays a pivotal role in uplifting marginalized communities in Delhi through targeted social programs and inclusive initiatives rooted in its mission to foster holistic development and social justice. By prioritizing education, skill development and community engagement, it empowers underserved groups, including youth, women and children through its Department of Social and Human Development.

As the New Delhi YMCA continues this legacy, it remains a vital force, inspiring and equipping generations to thrive in spirit, mind and body, while fostering unity and equity for all.

Coming from a financially challenged background, Nandini overcame significant obstacles with the support of New Delhi YMCA, which provided her with scholarships, mentorship, and timely assistance that shaped her future. Her return to the same coaching centre as visiting faculty was a proud and emotional milestone. Grateful to the Social and Human Development Department and CDC Savda Ghevra, Nandini's story stands as a testament to the life-changing impact of New Delhi YMCA and the boundless possibilities that emerge when potential is nurtured with the right support.

Ms. Muskan's inspiring journey from CDC Kalyanpuri to becoming the first financially independent girl in her family is a remarkable testament to resilience and the transformative power of education. Despite financial hardships that forced her to drop out after Class X, Muskan pursued skill-building courses at the New Delhi YMCA, including the NIIT CCMO Computer Course, and successfully completed her Class XII through NIOS. With determination and YMCA's guidance, she secured a position in the Admin Department at Cognoscente Invented Pvt. Ltd., Noida. Muskan's story stands as a beacon of hope, empowering young women in her community to pursue their dreams with courage and confidence.



Networking Visit to TLM Skill Development Center



A team from the New Delhi YMCA's Department of Social and Human Development, comprising Mr. Hemant Agarwal, Assistant General Secretary – SHD, Ms. Monica Singh, Programme Officer – SHD, and Ms. Kudsia Shamim, Community Organizer, visited The Leprosy Mission Trust India Skill Training Centre in Noida on 25th June 2025. The visit, initiated on the invitation of Dr. Reeti from TLM, provided valuable insights into TLM's skill development initiatives in Cosmetology and Computer IT, which are successfully linked to reputed job placements. The team engaged in meaningful discussions on future collaboration to extend skill training opportunities to underprivileged youth through YMCA and TLM partnership. The visit was both insightful and encouraging, opening avenues for impactful community engagement.

Awareness Generation Programme on Childhood Cancer

Awareness Generation Programme (AGP) on "Childhood Cancer" was organized on 7th May 2025 with parents and youth at Community Development Centre Karpoori Thakur. The Resource Person was Ms. Shanti, & Ms. Shuhangi, Senior Social Workers from "Can Kids, Kids Can". The aim was to create awareness on different types of Cancers among the children like Brain & Spinal Cord Tumors, Bone Cancer, Neuroblastoma etc. Their symptoms & precautions were also shared by the Resource Persons. Participants were also given Certificate of participation. 30 youth and their parents participated in the programme.

Awareness Generation Programme on Menstrual Hygiene

Awareness Generation Programme (AGP) on 'Menstrual Hygiene' was conducted on 21st May 2025 for adolescent girls at the Community Development Centre Daya Basti. The Resource Person was Ms. Nirmal Kaur, a student intern from Aditi Mahavidyalaya, University of Delhi. Purpose of the programme was to educate adolescent girls about the importance of menstrual hygiene, dispel common myths and promote healthy practices. 21 Adolescent girls participated in the programme.



Awareness Generation Programme on No Tobacco

Awareness Generation Programme on 'No Tobacco' was organized on 23rd May 2025 for the youth of the Community Development Centre Daya Basti. The Resource Person was Ms. Nirmal Kaur, a student intern from Aditi Mahavidyalaya, University of Delhi. The purpose of the AGP was to educate the students about the dangers of tobacco use, its impact on health and the importance of living a healthy lifestyle. The interactive session aimed at informative content highlighting the risks associated with tobacco consumption. It created a strong impact, encouraging students to adopt healthier habits and become advocates for a tobacco-free society. 24 Youth participated in the programme.

Awareness Generation Programme on Government Entitlements & Schemes

Awareness Generation Programme on "Government Entitlements & Schemes"- Ayushman Card, Aadhar Card, E-Shram, PAN Card and other related schemes" was organised on 23rd May 2025 with Community Women at Community Development Centre Kalyanpuri. AGP was organised in networking with Centre for Advocacy and Research (CFAR) NGO. The aim of the programme was to empower Community Women with knowledge of their rights, benefits and social welfare and Government Entitlements & Schemes and how to enroll and access these Government Schemes. The Resource Person was Ms. Shakeela, Coordinator of Centre for Advocacy and Research (CFAR) NGO.



"Career Guidance" Session with NIIT Foundation

A session on Career Guidance was organized in collaboration with NIIT Foundation for youth across all five Community Development Centres. The sessions were conducted at CDC Kalyanpuri and Sunlight Colony on 19th May 2025, CDC Daya Basti and Karpoori Thakur on 5th June 2025, and CDC Savda-Ghevra on 13th June 2025. The objective was to help the youth identify their strengths and interests, and to explore various career options after completing Class XII and Graduation. Discussions also included information on market-relevant courses aligned with current career opportunities. The sessions were facilitated by Ms. Mansi Aggarwal, Assistant Manager – Placement, NIIT Foundation. A total of 202 youth participated in the programme across all five Community Development Centres.

World Environment Day Celebration

On the occasion of World Environment Day on 5th June 2025 all five Community Development Centres organised Awareness through Cleanliness and Tree Plantation Drive at the CDCs with the Youth and Children. This exercise was done to educate the students on the importance of protecting the Environment by keeping it clean. The drive was conducted to make the children and youth aware on the importance of the good and clean environment through Screening of Documentary Films, display of Posters, Quiz Competition and Tree Plantation at the Centres. 312 youth participated in the programme at all the Community Development Centres.



International Yoga Day

International Yoga Day was celebrated at the Community Development Centres Kalyanpuri, Karpoori Thakur, Sunlight Colony, Savda-Ghevra and Daya Basti on 21st June 2025 with all the students of the Community Development Centres and Alternative Learning Centres. International Yoga Day celebration aimed to teach the students the importance of amazing health benefits of Yoga, like reducing health problems, good mental and physical health. Students displayed different poses of Yoga Asanas and even the young children of the Balwadi class participated in the International Yoga Day Celebration. 1500 students took part in the celebration of International Yoga Day across all five Community Development Centres.

Street Theatre Festival Competition

Three enthusiastic teams from New Delhi YMCA's Community Development Centres at Kalyanpuri, Sunlight Colony, and Savda Ghevra proudly participated in the Street Theatre Festival Competition – "Manch for Change," organized by the YWCA of Delhi on 28th June 2025. Competing against 20 organizations, CDC Savda Ghevra secured First Prize, while CDC Sunlight Colony won Third Prize, earning cash awards, gift vouchers, and valuable photography course scholarships for their outstanding performances. This achievement reflects the creativity, passion, and leadership of YMCA's young performers, who effectively used street theatre to promote diversity, inclusiveness, youth leadership, and sustainability.





Event Management students of IMSIT participated in a hands-on floral décor workshop during an educational visit to the Ghazipur Flower Market on 27th May 2025. Led by faculty member Mr. Hemant Mehra, the visit provided students with practical exposure to the floral supply chain, including sourcing, pricing, and seasonal availability. This experiential learning initiative successfully bridged theoretical knowledge with real-world application, enhancing the students' professional competencies in event management.

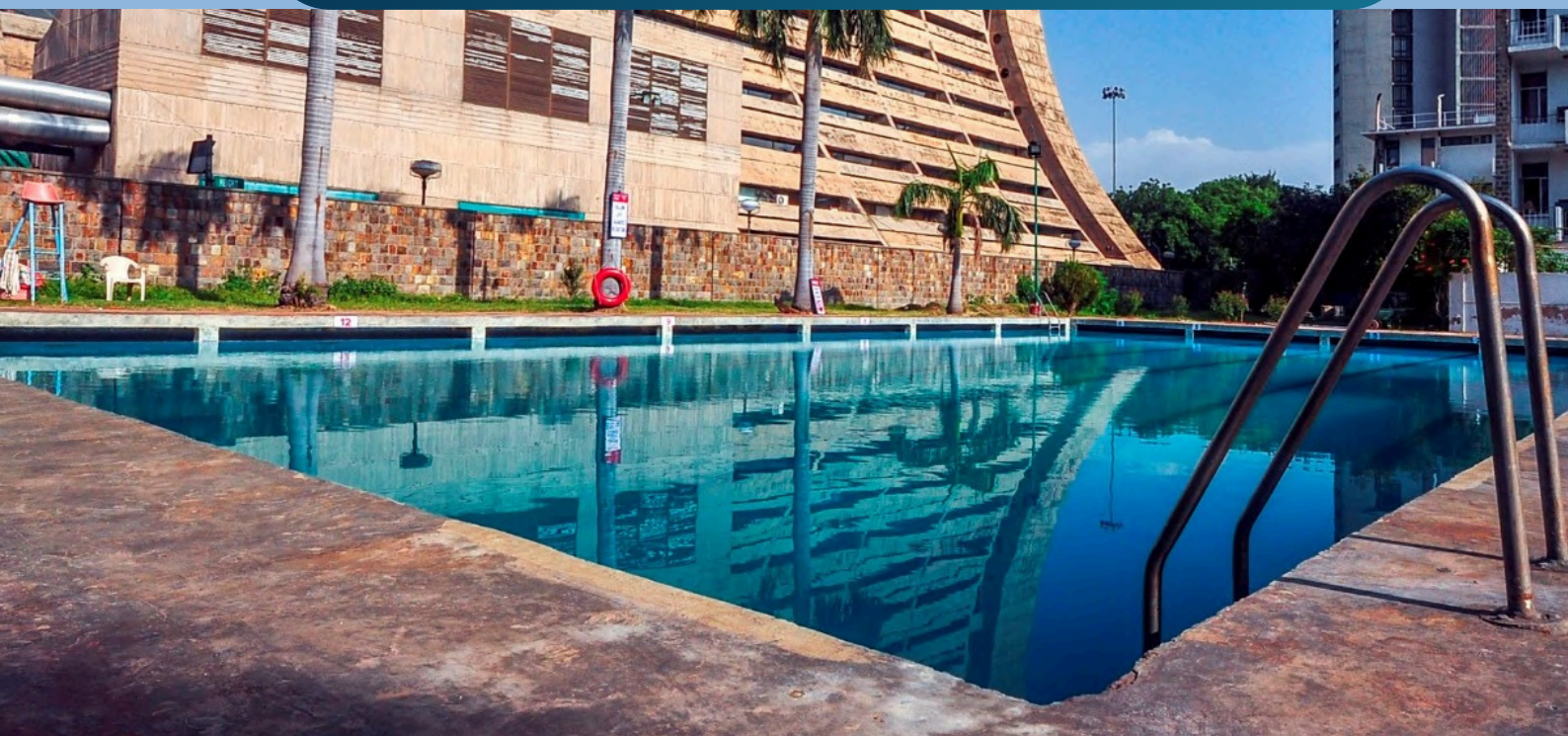
Workshop on Interview Skills
