The National Council of YMCAs of India (NCYI) is the apex body of YMCAs across India, with over 700 YMCAs, which came into existence on February 20, 1891, in Madras and is in the 130th year of its formation as a national body. Thereafter the national headquarter shifted to Calcutta and was housed at 86, college street in the northern part of Calcutta and later at 5, Russel in Central Calcutta finally relocated to the Massey hall, New Delhi in 1964 and in 1975 moved to Bharat Yuvak Bhavan and in 2015 shifted to K. T. Paul building in the same Indian YMCA premises. The Movement membership exceeding 300,000 and considered the largest network of YMCAs in the Asia Pacific Region besides, its pre-eminence in the global set-up, the World's Alliance of YMCAs. There are 109 YMCA Professional Secretaries on the national roster in India at present.

The New Delhi YMCA is dedicated to making the world a better place to live by promoting social responsibility, community service and youth empowerment. Through its various programmes in education, health, skill development and social welfare, the YMCA nurtures values of compassion, equality and integrity. It provides opportunities for young people to grow into responsible citizens and encourages active participation in building inclusive and sustainable communities. By fostering understanding among people of different backgrounds and faiths, the New Delhi YMCA continues to inspire positive change, strengthen communities and create a more peaceful and caring world for all.




VASTU SHASTRA GUEST SESSION




Inter "Y" Movement National Youth Assembly, Shimla 2025


