

## *Success Stories*

### Ms. Rekha

Ms. Rekha, originally from Rajasthan and now residing in Nehru Nagar, Delhi, lives in a joint family with her husband, children and in-laws. Bound by strict traditions of veil and purdah, she remained confined to her home with limited support after marriage.



In 2016, her life changed when she was introduced to the Self-Help Group (SHG) programme by YMCA CDC Daya Basti. Joining the SHG became a turning point, helping her gain confidence and access new opportunities. She enrolled in the Diploma in Cutting and Tailoring at YMCA's Alternative Learning Centre, Zakhira, marking her first step outside her home.

The experience helped her build a new identity within her community. Her dedication led to her selection as a Visiting Faculty for the same course in 2016. An exposure visit to the YMCA Sattal campsite further strengthened her self-confidence. Today, Ms. Rekha serves as a Visiting Faculty for Balwadi and Cutting & Tailoring courses at YMCA CDC Daya Basti. She is now self-reliant, financially independent, and an inspiration to many women.

## Round Table Meeting organized by the YWCA of Delhi




New Delhi YMCA participated in a Round Table Meeting on Technology-Facilitated Gender Violence organized by the YWCA of Delhi on 5th December 2025.


