At the same time, we are pained to lose a young member of our extended New Delhi YMCA family. Enosh Nathaniel Prem would have been 34 this September. But destiny had it otherwise. Son of former President Mr. Peter Prem and nephew of Board member Mr Joel Prem left for his heavenly abode on February 17. It was a big shock to hear the news while returning from Saattal after inauguration of the two properties.

The Lake View Inn was formally inaugurated on February 13 by 97-yearold Ms Lillian Wallace, who played an even bigger role when it came to Dorothy Villa. The Villa, bought from Ms Wallace, was inaugurated the very next day. Both inaugurations were simple but significant, exemplifying the YMCA ideals. President Mr. Jovial Vaghela, eight other Board members, Secretaries and many members of local church were witness to the dedication service of the two properties. Rev N C George, Acharya from Saattal Christian Ashram, delivered the special message at both the services. Praise and Worship by local young performers stood out as a major highlight.

The inauguration, streamed live on Facebook, was watched by people around the country. With Spring in the air, new beginnings can't stay far. For instance, the activities at New Delhi YMCA are nearing the pre-Covid levels. The Tourist Hostel, the Education and Sports Department have begun running normally. The swimming pool is all set to reopen. The same goes for Nizamuddin School. And, with the launch of Lake View Inn and a Programme Centre at Dorothy Villa, New Delhi YMCA will soon have a wider reach to the community.

orothy Villa in Sattal was officially converted into a Programme Centre of New Delhi YMCA at a lively dedication ceremony on February 14. The Villa belonged to 97-year-old Ms. Lillian Wallace who has been involved in the community social work in Uttarakhand for over five decades. Ms. Wallace and her old associate Eileen Richards were present during the



ceremony, attended by nine Board members, NDY Secretaries, some Executives and members of local church.

"Sister Eileen and I are happy. We are getting to an age where we have to look for something. We are happy that we have taken the action to surrender the house and property to the New Delhi YMCA. We know they will take care of the building. But more important thing is that we serve the people of this area," cautioned Ms. Wallace after unveiling a plaque to dedicate the Villa to New Delhi YMCA.

Mr Mark Clive, General Secretary & CEO of New Delhi YMCA assured Ms. Wallace that New Delhi YMCA will continue to serve the community in Saatal. `` This programme centre will be purely for our social development activities. Reminding the role of YMCA, Mr Clive said, "YMCA is based on Christian principles. But it serves community and every human being who is willing to take benefit from YMCA."

Rev N C George, Acharya of the Christian Ashram delivered a sermon on the occasion while young Rydell Medley and members of Redemption Ministries offered Praise and Worship.


Mr. Harish Bisht, owner of the Inn,


